






South side of Albany Street looking west before fires, <u>Loka Leaf</u> is building on left. Note five stone buildings and flanking Federal style commercial buildings.

Interior former Albert's building, now Allure Dance Studio, third story framing for public hall space with circular opening to skylight and cupola.




Public Square looking east showing narrower street and general appearance around 1920.



Similar view as above showing Public Square with plantings and Masonic Lodge building with porches.




Painting looking west over the Public Square with Century House (red) before alterations, newly planted trees on the Public Square and John Lincklaen's land office in the distance by the lake.
