| # | Address | Photo | Architectural Style | Resident & Cazenovia Duration, House Features |
|---|----------------|---|---------------------|---|
| 1 | 32 Albany St |  | Federal | Home of William Hough during 1820-21, 1828-1855. Author of legislation to create Smithsonian Museum. Symmetrical rectangular shape; door side lights, and slender door architrave. Understated roof frieze and cornice. |
| 2 | 34 Albany St |  | Federal | Home of Dwight Williams predominantly during 1898 - 1932. Landscape painter. Distinctive Federal features: fan in gable, dentil moldings in cornice. Greek Revival porch added in later years. |
| 3 | 8 Chenango St |  | Federal | Home of Wallace Robb during 1922-1924, Poet and Naturalist. Excellent example of Federal style, with delicate side lights and fan light, symmetrical windows, slender gable returns. |
| 4 | 30 Nelson |  | Late Federal | Home of Merrill Bailey 1909-1981, Artist, at this house during 1961-1981. Slender gable returns; upper windows, porch likely added later. |
| 5 | 42 Nelson |  | Italianate | Home of Lucia Zora Card during 1877-1897, Circus Performer & Animal trainer. Flat roof, deep, overhanging eaves. |
| 6 | 46 Nelson |  | Queen Anne | Home of Merrill Bailey (see above) 1930- 1937 and parents George & Elsie. Multiple cross pitched roofs, large porch. |
| 7 | 4013 Thomas Rd |  | Post-Greek Revival | Home of Steven Suhey during 1930s -1940, All American Football Athlete. Of later construction (ca. 1880-1910) but retaining many elements of Greek Revival style. |
| 8 | 9 Nelson |  | Federal | Home of Philo Felter during 1870 - 1880, Inventor of Wafer Lock, Am. Lock Co. Symmetrical windows, gable returns since removed; possible later house addition. |

| 9 | 40 Farnham @ William St |  | Late Federal | Home of J. F. Crawford during 1870-1897, Inventor of Reversible Mower & Reaper. Slender gable returns and symmetry, though house reflect emerging Greek Revival influence. |
| 10 | 9 Center |  | Federal | Home of E. G. Weld during 1845-1874, Daguerrotype of Frederick Douglass 1850 Convention. Tall symmetrical framing & windows; light modest gable returns. |
| 11 | 128 Lincklaen |  | Queen Anne | Home of J. A. Loyster during 1913 -1931, Inventor of Theater Ticket & Machine. Built ca 1888 by Cameron. Assymetrical massing, multi-gabled roof; single & triple windows. |
| 12 | 1 Nickerson |  | Italianate | Home of Austin Van Riper during 1845-1859, Tower Clock Maker. Low pitched hip roof with projecting eaves, wide frieze, flat arched lintels. |
| 13 | 19 Albany |  | "Modern" Gothic Revival | Home of Walter V.T.Clark during 1942-44, Author of <i>Ox-Bow Incident</i> . Architect, Horatio N. White. Built ca 1866 by Geo Lledyard Sr for mother-in-law, Mary Fitzhugh. |
| 14 | 4571 Ridge Rd |  | Queen Anne Colonial Revival | Home of Robert B. Davis during 1905-1915, Baking Powder King and Lucretia Davis Jephson, from 1905 - 1978, Education Philanthropist. Steeply pitched cross gables, round turret, variegated bay windows. Colonial Revival exterior refinements in thin pilasters and clapboarding. |
